### **SRA Board – solicitor member**

The Solicitors Regulation Authority is the independent regulatory arm of the Law Society. It sets, monitors and enforces standards for over 100,000 solicitors working in England and Wales.

The Law Society has recently appointed a chair, Charles Plant, and 13 members to serve on the SRA Board from 1 January 2010. The Society is seeking to recruit a further solicitor member who has strong experience of private-client practice, ideally in a firm of five or fewer partners.

Members will be expected to contribute at Board and other meetings to help to secure the provision of high quality legal services and ensure that the solicitors' profession and solicitors' firms meet the needs of clients effectively. Applicants should be capable of commanding the respect and confidence of the profession and the public.

An annual fee of £8500 is payable for an expected 16 day commitment.
